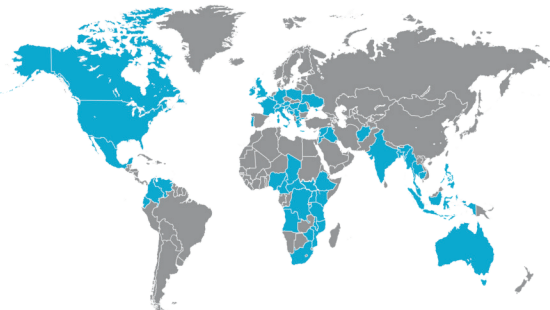


## About JRS

## REBUILDING A FUTURE

In our **livelihoods** and **economic inclusion** programmes, we work with various stakeholders so more displaced people can develop skills, secure employment, and start businesses. These improved opportunities lead to economic self-sufficiency while also promoting integration.



## PROMOTING PEACE AND JUSTICE

In the spirit of promoting peace and building more united societies, our **reconciliation** work aims to create healthy relationships among the refugees we serve, between refugee and host communities, and among our teams around the world.



## FOSTERING RESILIENCE

Our **Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS)** focuses on the prevention of mental health problems. Our services are provided at the individual, family, and community levels to reduce suffering and improve mental health and psychosocial well-being.



## ADDRESSING CLIMATE CHANGE

Through our accompaniment we strengthen the **climate resilience** of the people we serve by analysing the effects of climate change on forced displacement, and advocating for eco-social justice and protection mechanisms for the affected displaced people.



## LEARNING IN DISPLACEMENT

We improve access to quality **education** for refugees. Our programmes include all levels of formal education, vocational training, teacher formation, and a focus on girls and children with special needs. Learning provides stability and restores trust and hope for the future.



## ADVOCATING FOR HUMAN RIGHTS

Our **advocacy** takes place at local, regional, and international levels to empower forcibly displaced persons to claim their rights, lobby for governmental and institutional action to address the root causes of forced displacement, and work for sustainable and durable solutions.
